The board of Directors & Disciplines officers want to wish all of our members & families a Happy Holidays.

We have always had a problem keeping the washboards off of the grade at the entrance to the range. The board has been saving money for major projects. This year we decided to pave the road from the top of the hill to the RSO trailer. Our treasury would only allow for 2200ft of pavement. We might get enough next years to finish it. We have been asked if we will pave the road from the dump to the range. That section of road is city owned so we cannot pave it.

Due to some differences between the ICORE shooters & the club they have decided to shoot at another venue. When we find out were they are shooting we will let you know the location.

The clubs training trailer & Training pits are complete & we are using them for classes and training. It is nice to be able to have our training all done at the range.

The board of directors would like to thank the RSO's for their time & effort in keeping the courtesy range open & safe. They all volunteer their time and it is appreciated.

I have noticed that members are shooting up the target frames on the silhouette range & the club pits and leaving the pieces lay. Please pick up your trash & put it in the trashcans. Put your targets in the center section of the frame so you don't shoot up the frames.

High power range: We have had to make some changes pertaining to the use of the "known distance" or long rifle range. Due to safety concerns this range will only be used for club sanctioned events. There have been instances of shooters setting up behind others at the 200 or 300-yard line. Additionally, ricochets coming from the action pits have been an issue on the 300-yard line as well as bullet spatter from the silhouette targets. There has been damage done to the uprights on the target frames on the distant range. The uprights on the metal target frames are 10ft. 2X4 boards with special brackets attached to hold the target frames are time consuming & expensive to make.

The silhouette range can and should be used for rifle shooting. Targets in place go from 200 meters to beyond 800 meters. There are rails to locate targets closer in for rim fire shooting. There are also places to put target frames at 50 and 100 yards as well as near each of the metal silhouettes. In addition to rifles this area can also be used for shotgun slugs and scoped, high power hunting handguns. In addition to all this there are plenty of solid shooting benches and tables for your convenience. Please try to police your empty shell casings when you are through.
